



Handsome constructed with Doric columns, this spectacular Greek Revival was built in 1836 and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. It was once home to Maxwell Perkins, famed editor of such literary legends as F. Scott Fitzgerald, Tom Wolfe, Ernest Hemingway, and Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings. Located in God's Acre, a long-established district in New Canaan, the home is a five-minute walk to the town center.
