A [manor house](#) built in 1930 in North Stamford, by the late Richard Salomon is on the market for \$2,295,000, listed by William Pitt Sotheby's International Realty.

Salomon was the President and Chairman of the cosmetic company Charles of the Ritz, ultimately acquired by Revlon. The stone and shingle residence was originally constructed on a 30-acre estate by Salomon and his wife. Upon the passing of the Salomons, the estate was purchased by Sidney Frank of Jagermeister and Grey Goose Vodka fame.

Frank partnered with developers to develop the estate into The Ponds, a 30-acre gated enclave in North Stamford that includes five homes on four-acre parcels. Frank kept the original manor house on five-plus landscaped acres with The Ponds, and sold it to its current owners, Sue and Bob Stone, in 2003.

"Private and serene yet easily accessible to nearby Greenwich and downtown Stamford, this stone and shingle home is a true classic," said William Pitt Sotheby's International Realty listing agent Janet Jorgensen. "Totally renovated, sophisticated and rich in architectural details, the home enjoys a lushly landscaped setting graced by stone walls and a spring-fed pond, and is situated in a unique enclave of stunning homes. 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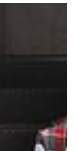
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
