Dunlop's work before opening night.

In addition to showcasing his artwork and greeting guests at 5 p.m. Dunlop will discuss the "psychology of perception" and how it is recognized

"I am so excited that David's work will be featured in our Rowayton brokerage," said Darien agent Molly Crosland, who spearheads much of the brokerage's artist series.
