Dividing her time between New York and Connecticut, Langotsky's paintings and ceramics additionally have been displayed at ARTworks Gallery in Norwalk, as well as Earthworks Gallery in New York. All of Langotsky's work remains in private collections throughout the United States

The June 7 reception will showcase some of Langotsky's latest work, which includes painted landscapes inspired by her life in Rowayton, where she now currently resides. Wine and hors d'oeuvres will be served in a casual setting with opportunities to talk with Langotsky, and discuss her work.
