1 ◀ Philadelphia Built by Robert Venturi in 1965, the Vanna Venturi House is considered the first postmodern building in the country. Recognized as a significant architectural contribution, the three-bedroom home is designed around rectangular, diagonal, and curving elements. Features include a stairway to nowhere, a bedroom with a lunette window, and a door in every room leading to the outside. \$1,750,000. 2 ▶ Fairfield, Va. This three-bedroom dome lies on 36 acres overlooking the Blue Ridge Mountains. The three-floor home, built in 2004, has triangular windows, a cathedral ceiling, a spiral staircase, a stone fireplace, and a cupola with an observation room. 3 ◀ Hamison, N.Y. This five-bedroom home was built in 1969 but underwent a complete remodel in 2005. The interior includes granite floors, oversize skylights, and a bilevel master suite with a fireplace, a sauna, a Jacuzzi, and two walk-in closets.
