













NEW CANAAN, CONNECTICUT

Philip Johnson's 1953 Wiley House, one

of the architect's best-loved residential projects, anchors this six-acre woodland compound, whose current owner has gone to great lengths to enhance and expand the property while respecting Johnson's original aesthetic. In 2011, the Connecticut

firm Roger Ferris + Partners created an 1,800-square-foot barn—currently a gallery space—plus

a garage and a poolhouse. Meanwhile, the sculptural main dwelling, which consists of a glass-enclosed great room perched atop a masonry base containing the bedrooms, has been meticulously restored.
