

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history, once owned by John L. Marion, a renowned luxury auctioneer serving as chairman of Sotheby's auction house in New York City.

Rare for its central location, the property is a short stroll to Cherry Lawn Park, the downtown shopping district and train station.

Previous owners lovingly restored the homes inner-workings, including electrical and plumbing, which is no small feat for an 1820s home.

Inside, the home maintains the grandeur and craftsmanship of yesteryear.





A circular foyer large enough to be used as a sitting room that opens into a charming sunroom with two full walls of windows with a scalloped cornice adds plenty of character.

A large formal dining room features a stunning wood-burning fireplace with a white marble surround and floor-to-ceiling paneled mantle flanked by two sets of arched built-ins.

While the home does not offer the open-concept layout many newer construction properties boast, the rooms are surprisingly large with plenty of hard-to-come-by handcrafted detail.

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A spacious sitting room featuring a wood-burning fireplace with a custom mantle opens into a grand step-down formal living room with a barrel vaulted ceiling, oversized wood - fireplace and two sets of French doors.

"This space is reminiscent of old-world entertaining," said Michelle Donzeiser, a realtor with William Pitt Sotheby's International Realty.

A sun-filled kitchen features honed granite counters with a butcher-block center island, a sixburner Wolf range and double Shaw's Original Fireclay farmhouse sink.

A step-down breakfast room overlooks the property's guesthouse and pool area and a centralized homework area offers a convenient work space just off the kitchen.

A sunken great room features soaring cathedral ceilings with hand-planked wooden beams, a brick wood-burning fireplace and French doors leading to a stone terrace.

The second floor of the home features two guest bedrooms sharing Jack-and-Jill bath with a periwinkle-hued herringbone tile floor with a penny tile inlay in keeping with the period of the home.

A third guest bedroom lends itself as a nursery and a fourth includes its own marble bath.

The third floor offers two additional guest bedrooms and a full bath, rounding out at seven bedrooms and four full baths inside the main property.

A detached guesthouse includes two separate entrances, ideal for accommodating multiple guests at the same time and a greenhouse for the avid gardener.

The guesthouse features two bedrooms, a living area, full bath and kitchenette on one side and a bedroom, living room and full bath on the other.

A free-form pool and spa includes an outdoor cabana with a sauna and shower.

The master suite features a white marble wood-burning fireplace, his and hers closets and a master en suite with a dual vanity, sunken tub and step-in shower.
