▲ If you want to live and work among history, this home — and home office — are for you. At 60 White St., just off Broadway, this 1869 building, which recently completed its condo conversion, offers the "quintessential" downtown live/work situation: a floor-through loft (1,943 square feet altogether) with two bedrooms and separate office. If you're looking to move on up to the East Side - and live in a deluxe apartment in the sky - look no further. This five-bedroom co-op stands inside a 1921-built edifice designed by J.E.R. Carpenter - one of the early 20th century's most prominent architects. Located at 950 Park Ave., at East 82nd Street, this dwelling boasts high ceilings, large windows and 90 feet of Park Avenue frontage. A light-filled foyer leads to the spacious living room, formal dining room, chef's kitchen and a cozy library. A separate hallway brings you to the private quarters, as well as a study. "Law & Order: Special Victims Unit" — can be yours for \$3.75 million. This home, designed by famed architect William Storm, is a stone's throw from Alexander Hamilton's former residence. Located at 21 Hamilton Terrace, near West 141st Street, this mighty structure stands five stories high and

▲ New Canaan, Conn. — an affluent town some 50 miles from midtown Manhattan — is known for its stock of modern homes designed by the Harvard Five architects. Now, a lucky buyer can call this 6,275-square-foot manse, a property at 8l Cross Ridge Rd. that was designed by one of these architects, home. The Brown House, originally a single-level midcentury-modern home crafted by Eliot Noyes, saw a second-story addition in 2003 in accordance with the architect's original vision. It boasts five bedrooms, five bathrooms and a halfbath. Additional touches include spacious entertaining areas and a chef's kitchen lit by natural light that floods in through large windows. A pool and pool house complete the package.
