What are some tips to prepare a home to put on the market?

Some of the steps that should be taken to prepare your home

Decluttering, especially closets and cabinets. Get rid of any

expensive way to give any room a lift.

Refresh hardwood floors or have the carpeting cleaned.

Update kitchen and bathroom hardware.

Clean windows and let the natural sunlight in.

>> Eliminate unpleasant odors.

Don't forget about the garage; it is still a part of the home. Declutter and organize the space as much as possible.

On the exterior, and when the weather permits, freshen mulch and landscaping. You want the buyers to feel welcomed as they come down the driveway. Sweep the front walk and porch. Be sure that the front door and the area surrounding it are clean and welcoming. Add a seasonal wreath.

Try to see your home through the eyes of the prospective buyers. Is there anything that would give them the perception that there would be a significant amount of work that they would have to undertake? If so, take care of that now. The goal is to make the buyers feel comfortable and at home.

When showing your home, be

sure to leave all of the lights on and all of the interior doors open. It is also nice to leave a small bowl of candy with a sign inviting the prospective buyers to enjoy a piece or two.
