Modern home holds its own in historic Washington, CT

n a historic Litchfield County town such as Washington, Colonial homes are often such antiquities that they are literally Colonial. Alas, that's not the case with this 50-year-old dwelling on Baldwin Hill Road. In a historic Litchfield County town such as Washington, entire neighborhoods are populated with livable structures which were built before the country was a nation, and thus boast of tales about American nobility. These are places on wide swaths of land which were residences for those soldiers who fought for Gen. George Washington, and who fought for Gen. Ulysses S. Grant,

and who fought for Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower. Again, that's not the case with this relatively young, peaceful, and charming gambrel home which rests on but an acre of land and on a rural thoroughfare in the countryside. This Colonial of a more recent era tells a tale not of militia and

changing times in the United States, but of the health and beauty promoted by its series of only two homeowners. "I bought it from the estate of Dr. Jane Lockwood, who was a very highly respected physician in Greenwich, and Chief of Medicine at Greenwich Hospital during World War II, at a time when not too many men were available to practice medicine," said current owner Susan Bishop. In other words, it's a good thing that the home's ceilings are not made of glass, because Dr. Lockwood would have shattered it. "She built it as an homage to her own beloved childhood home," noted An-
