# William Pitt's 'Sundays at Sotheby's' series returns with artist reception

**R**owayton — William Pitt Sotheby's International Realty recently announced that the firm's Rowayton brokerage will be hosting an artist reception as part of the "Sunday's at Sotheby's" series, a monthly program in which the office welcomes new art to display in its office.

The reception is typically held on the first Sunday of each month. Artist David Morico will introduce his work from 4 to 6 p.m. Sunday, May 6.

Wine and hors d'oeuvres will also be served in a casual setting with opportunities to talk with Morico and discuss his work. The art will be on display all month.
