

## MODERN-DAY DWELLINGS

In the 1940s, sculptor and architect bimel kehm bought a circa-1700s hay barn in New Canaan with a plan to convert it into a home and studio. Kehm retained the original columns and beams, wide-board chestnut floors and mansard roof. And while the structure's exteriors resemble a classic colonial, the 3,252-square-foot interiors are lofty and open-plan with a striking double-height dining room.
