

**This week: Homes built in the 1920s**

**1 ► Charlotte, N.C.** This five-bedroom home in the heart of Myers Park dates to 1929. The Georgian-style house retains historic details and includes a family room with wet bar and wood-burning fireplace, a gourmet kitchen, a breakfast room opening to a covered back porch, a basement playroom, and a private guest suite. The half-acre lot has lawns, mature trees and shrubs, a courtyard, and a two-car garage. \$2,650,000. Jocelyn Rose, HM Properties, (704) 975-9900



**2 ◀ Fairfield, Conn.** Built in 1929, this six-bedroom Georgian Colonial was designed by architect Cameron Clark. The house features the original woodwork and moldings; fireplaces in the living and dining rooms; and a kitchen opening to a family room with a cathedral ceiling. The landscaped lot in Sasco Hill overlooks Southport Harbor, and includes a backyard terrace and a freestanding garage with a second-story loft. \$2,650,000. **3 ► Santa Barbara, Calif.** Casa Alegría ("House of Joy") sits above the Pacific Ocean on Santa Barbara's famed Riviera. Built in 1929 in Spanish Mediterranean style, the three-bedroom home has exposed-beam ceilings, carved alcoves, an updated chef's kitchen, and separate living and dining rooms, each with a fireplace and access to an ocean-view veranda.
